What makes a great project

For the project to be successful, there are a few things that you might want to consider.

All projects....

- Need to benefit people who live in North Birkenhead
- Be realistic and achievable

You could use the fund to design and deliver welcome hampers for new residents in the area, set up a playgroup, or purchase new equipment for an existing group. Last year we funded:

- Fun afternoons out for young people around Birkenhead North
- A playgroup for young children who have special educational needs, providing toys and resources for a special sensory room
- Resources and equipment to run free photography courses in the North End
- Gym and exercise equipment for children and young people

Examples of what we can fund

- Educational activities and new experiences for young people
- Connecting the community and reducing loneliness
- Improving the health and wellbeing of North End residents
- Boosting the use of green spaces and the environment
- Celebrating culture and heritage in North Birkenhead

Examples of what we can't fund

- Organisations with an annual income over £50,000
- Activities that will take place outside of North Birkenhead or benefit residents in another area
- Projects that will need permission from the local authority, housing association, private landowners or other parties
- Organisations that aren't local to Wirral
- Crisis packs, including food hampers
- Advertising (unless part of a project)
- Items that have already been bought
- Political activity
- Sponsorship and fundraising activities for the benefit of an individual or charity
- Employment costs or rent or property maintenance •
- Any additional spending that isn't included in your application
